

Planting Grapes

When selecting a location to plant grapes, it should be in a well-drained area with full sun. Grapes need to be planted with trellises to accommodate the vines of the plant. The vines do best when planted on a slope in sandy or gravely soil with a southern exposure.

Once a location is found, it is recommended to plant the rows going north and south to receive maximum sunlight. Approximately 15 feet should be left in between each grape plant on the trellis. If planting more than one row of grapes, space the rows approximately 9 feet apart.

Beta -

Vigorous, blue-black grape. Great for jelly and juice.

Zone 3-8

Bluebell -

Similar in size and color to "Concord" grapes with a more tender skin and a greater hardiness. Great table quality.

Zone 4-8

Concord -

Medium to large, blue-black grapes with medium to large clusters. Vigorous plant. Excellent for eating.

Zone 5-8

Concord Seedless -

A seedless variety similar to a "Concord" in flavor and color. Clusters and grapes are smaller in size. Great for jam, jelly and grape pie.

Zone 5-8

Edelweiss -

A vigorous green-white grape with high sugar content and a "grapy" flavor. Great dessert and wine grape. One of the most disease resistant varieties.

Zone 4-8

Frontenac -

A vigorous red wine grape that is hardy to approximately -30 °. Frontenac is downy and powdery mildew resistant.

Zone 4-8

Kay Gray -

A medium to large green-white grape that forms in small clusters on prolific vines. Kay Gray is hardy to approximately -40°. Great for wine making and eating fresh.

Zone 4-8

St. Croix -

A sweet medium to large dark blue grape that grows in medium sized bunches on productive vines. Great for wine making.

Zone 4-8

Reliance -

A red seedless table grape that is great for desserts, juice of eating fresh.

Zone 5-8

St. Theresa Seedless -

A purple, (mostly seedless) early season table grape that forms on vigorous woody vines. An excellent flavor for juice and jelly. Tolerates alkaline soils.

Zone 4-9

Somerset Seedless -

Small dark red grapes that form on tight, small clusters. Excellent flavor for a table or juice grape.

Zone 4-8

Valiant -

A blue grape, with full clusters. Equal or better than "Beta" in quality and hardiness.

Zone 4-8

Marquette -

A red hardy and disease resistant grape that is excellent for wine. Produces two clusters per shoot
